## Meet Donald Macaulay (First Tenor)

I was born in May, 1940, the eldest of 4 siblings, in Auchincloch, a coal mining village, near Glasgow. My father was a native of the Isle of Lewis in the Outer Hebrides. He spoke fluent Gaelic, something I was exposed to but never learned to speak.

As a 10 year old boy soprano I joined the Kirkintilloch Junior Choir. We performed all over Scotland and England. Our conductor, a Church of Scotland Minister, taught us using the tonic sol-fah system. We joined with the Glasgow Orpheus and the Scottish Junior Singers at a concert in Glasgow. A highlight was Sir Hugh S Robertson conducting the combined choirs in his arrangement of 'All in the April Evening', unaccompanied. In 1952 I began piping lessons in the Boys Brigade and joined the Clan Fraser Pipe Band in 1957. The 'Fraser' was a Grade 1 competition band. From May till August, we competed at the Highland Games. Tunes had to be memorised and we had to listen!

After completing High School I became an Apprentice Draughtsman in a local Cast Iron Foundry. I was committed to attending 'night-school' 3 nights a week for 5 years to obtain a National Certificate in Engineering. Having successfully completed my apprenticeship and studies in 1960, I became an Estimating Draughtsman in a Mechanical Handling manufacturing company in Glasgow.

Some months before Doreen and I married in June 1963 we applied to migrate to Australia. Word that our application was successful came just after our wedding day. In October 1963, on a wet evening, Doreen was selecting books in the local library. To pass the time away I casually scanned through the 'situations vacant' in a bundle of newspapers on one of the desks. An advert for draughtsmen with BHP in Whyalla South Australia caught my eye. I immediately sent off an application. Interviews and medicals were completed in Glasgow. We accepted a 2 year contract just before we set off for Australia. Having a job and a house waiting for us was a real bonus. Our journey began on the overnight train from Glasgow to London, no happy memories there. We left Southampton with approximately 1900 passengers on the 19<sup>th</sup> of May 1964 on board the T V Fairstar. Watching the gap between the wharf and the ship gradually increase made us ask 'what have we done?' No turning back now! Previously known as the Troop Ship Oxfordshire the vessel had been completely transformed in Holland for the lucrative migrant run from Britain to Australia. The Fairstar became one of the popular 'fun ships' cruising Australia and the Pacific Islands. We enjoyed the first part of our journey through the Bay of Biscay, past the Rock of Gibraltar into the Mediterranean for a brief stop at Port Said. On through the Suez Canal and Red Sea to the Port of Aden. Seeing that landscape for the first time reminded me of the pipe tune 'The Barren Rocks of Aden'. The 12 days from Aden to Fremantle were a nightmare! Battered by a monsoon we rolled and pitched our way across the Indian Ocean. Passengers were sick, dining rooms were almost empty and the bars were closed. Fremantle was a very welcome sight. A short train trip to Perth and the lovely Kings Park restored our spirits. Later that day we set off through the Great Australian Bight for Adelaide.

We berthed at Outer Harbour on 16<sup>th</sup> of June, 2 days after our 1<sup>st</sup> wedding anniversary. The final leg of our journey was on a DC3 to Whyalla. We moved into rental accommodation, provided by the Housing Trust. Mitchell Street, Whyalla West was to be our 'home' for the next 2 years. I think the landscape from Mitchell Street contained nothing but saltbush between us and Iron Knob. Quite a change from Glasgow. I worked in the Shipyard and Rolling Mill Drawing Offices. Within a week of arriving in Whyalla I was appointed Pipe Major of the City of Whyalla band. I drove a taxi, part time, to buy a new set of bagpipes.

To gain more experience we spent the next 18 months in Mannum, where I worked with David Shearer as a Design Draughtsman. I answered the 'call of the pipes' joining the John McDouall Stewart Memorial Pipe Band. I knew every turn and pothole on the Mannum/Chain of Ponds/Adelaide Road. Mid-week practices and private lessons and engagements made sure of that!

We purchased our first home in Largs Bay in 1968.

The Electricity Trust of South Australia became my employer for the next 26 years. As a Draughtsman/Technical Officer I became very familiar with Stobie Poles and the major Transmission Lines around the State.

I retired from ETSA in 1994 and spent the next 10 years working part time from home on the computer. I prepared drawings of 'in-line' weighing equipment. I also prepared drawings for Seed Cleaning Installations.

We really appreciated the opportunities we've had in South Australia. I've enjoyed full time employment since 1964. I was able to change employment when we felt it was best for us.

I served 10 years on the Board of Management of the Le Fevre Community Hospital, as a "community representative". I was Chairman for the last 5 years until the hospital closed.

In the early 90s I formed and conducted the Le Fevre Combined Churches Choir on the Peninsula. The choir was made up of folk from every denomination. My daughter, Linda, was the accompanist. For just over 12 years the choir took part in inter-denominational combined church services on the Peninsula. I was also a member of The Woodville Choir during this time. In December 1999, The Woodville Concert Choir presented Handel's *Messiah* with the Unley Chamber Orchestra in the Woodville Town Hall. I had the privilege of singing 'Comfort Ye' and 'Every Valley'.

We moved from Largs Bay to Semaphore in 1991. I've been very happily married to Doreen for 52 years. We have 4 children, 3 grandchildren and recently became great-grandparents. I had major by-pass surgery in The Royal Adelaide Hospital on Melbourne Cup Day in 1981. Just over 3 years ago I had a pacemaker implanted to regulate my pulse. This was replaced last year with a defibrillator.

I joined the AMVC because my wife read an article in the CO-TA magazine and recognized Bill from his time at Woodville High School. Our youngest daughter studied music at Woodville and went on the music trip to New Zealand. I'm glad Doreen gave me the push I needed to start singing again. I enjoy being a member of the AMVC and look forward to the Monday night practices.
