# Low-down on Kevin Fisher

born 1924



During the 1950s, 60s and 70s he sang with the South Australian National Opera, singing tenor roles in Merry Widow, Desert Song, Gypsy Baron, La Traviata and Martha. He joined the Elder Conservatorium Opera, Arnold Matters Pro-Opera

Consort, Adelaide Harmony Choir, sang with the Metropolitan Musical Theatre and Mayfair Theatre singing many tenor roles.

In 1971 he won the Tenor Solo Competition at the Adelaide Eisteddfod.

In 1972 he, with his wife, Ivy, started the family business which he is still enjoying to this day.

He joined the Glenlea Singers in 1980 with his sisters. Kevin always enjoyed solo singing best of all, and it wasn't until he joined the Adelaide Male Voice Choir, in the late 1980s under the baton of Bill Shaw and the accompanist Margaret Lambert, and later Eddie Kriek, did he really love his choir singing.

Kevin's wife, Ivy, says that if Kevin isn't singing around the house she knows something is wrong.

Leo Fisher, Kevin's father, met his wife Mary, when he was the accompanist at a concert where she was singing. Leo had his own dance band, performing in the country and Adelaide. He also accompanied at rehearsals for Peter Dawson. Kevin had uncles, aunts and grandparents who were singers and all performed on stages around Adelaide.

Singing around the piano was part of the Fisher family life. There were seven children so there was plenty of noise, music and fun on Saturday nights.

*For a number of years Kevin has been and is the mainstay of the first tenor section. He loves singing solos but is also very happy being part of the choir.*

Kevin's first solo performance was at school when he was 9 or 10. The sister asked if anyone could give an impromptu performance in class. Kevin sang a Jack Hulbert song, "The Flies Crawled Up the Windows". The sister recognised he had a singing voice and began teaching him songs to sing in school concerts.

No more singing training until Kevin had been in the Airforce and served overseas in the United Kingdom. Married Ivy in 1949 and fathered four children. During 1952 Kevin, his two sisters, Mary and Pat, brothers, Brian and Dudley, joined a group to perform two Australian musicals, "Reedy River" and "Under the Coolabah Tree". During this period someone suggested he should have his voice trained and so began his life singing many solo parts in musicals.

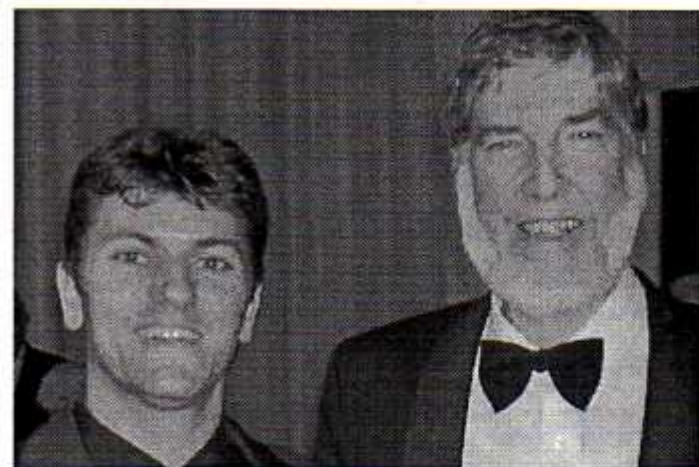

# In Concert

We have had three small concerts (at Immanuel College auditorium for Legacy Widows, the Masonic Homes at Somerton Park and the Lutheran Retirement Village, Glynde) and one major concert since our last newsletter.

The major concert was our annual concert which was held in conjunction with St David's Lodge at the Freemasons' Hall, North Terrace, Adelaide.

The concert started off with a rousing song, "Brothers, Sing On" by Edvard Grieg. This was followed by "Swansea Town", "Die Lorelei" and Bound for the "Rio Grand" finished off the bracket.

The Orpheus Quintet, a group of students (Alana Probert, leader, on flute; Stephanie Lavan, flute; Lucy Eckermann, clarinet; Emily South, bassoon; Braden Schiller, french horn) from Elder Conservatorium, then performed a selection of numbers and was very much appreciated.

The next bracket of songs from the choir started with "Aura Lee", followed by "L'Amour de Moy" a lovely, gentle French song in which Tasso Bouyessis performed the solo tenor part. The choir then performed the exciting Israeli folk song, "Hava Nageela", again with Tasso as solo tenor. This brought us to the interval.

After the interval we started with the beautiful Scottish folk song "Annie Laurie" arranged by our conductor, Bill Shaw, for solo tenor (Tasso) and the choir. The most unusual song of the entire concert came next - "Tahiti", and we finished this bracket with an old favourite, "The Finnish Forest".

Next came one of the audiences' favourites, Eddie Kriek, playing a wonderful and varied selection of numbers and once again showed why he is so popular at our concerts.

After Eddie the choir sang the final bracket of songs - "The Yeomen of England", "Kalinka" (another arrangement by Bill Shaw and another solo by Tasso) and finally "I Still Call Australia Home" (arranged by Bill Shaw).
